

Out to 2030, the global energy storage market is bolstered by an annual growth rate of 21% to 137 GW and 442 GWh by 2030, according to BNEF forecasts. In the same period, global solar and wind markets are expected to see compound annual growth rates ...

This report, supported by the U.S. Department of Energy's Energy Storage Grand Challenge, summarizes current status and market projections for the global deployment of selected energy storage technologies in the transportation and stationary markets.

The global energy storage market almost tripled in 2023, the largest year-on-year gain on record. Growth is set against the backdrop of the lowest-ever prices, especially in China where turnkey energy storage system costs in February were 43% lower than a year ago at a record low of \$115 per kilowatt-hour for two-hour energy storage systems.

Global energy storage deployment surged 62% in 2020, and we expect the global market to grow 27-fold by 2030. But where will growth come from? What technologies will triumph? And what will it all cost?

Global energy storage's record additions in 2022 will be followed by a 23% compound annual growth rate to 2030, with annual additions reaching 88GW/278GWh, or 5.3 times expected 2022 gigawatt installations. China overtakes the US as the largest energy storage market in megawatt terms by 2030.

Report Overview. The global energy storage systems market recorded a demand was 222.79 GW in 2022 and is expected to reach 512.41 GW by 2030, progressing at a compound annual growth rate (CAGR) of 11.6% from 2023 to 2030.

Global installed storage capacity is forecast to expand by 56% in the next five years to reach over 270 GW by 2026. The main driver is the increasing need for system flexibility and storage around the world to fully utilise and integrate larger shares of variable renewable energy (VRE) into power systems. An estimated 387GW/1,143GWh of new energy storage capacity will be added globally from 2022 to 2030 - more than Japan's entire power generation capacity in 2020. The US and China are set to remain the two largest markets, representing over half of global storage installations by the end of the decade.
