



# How to remember solar system planets in order

How do you remember the Order of planets in our Solar System?

This uses the first letter of each planet as the first letter of each word in a sentence. Supposedly, experts say, the sillier the sentence, the easier it is to remember.

How many planets are in the Solar System?

The Solar System consists of 8(9) planets which you are going to want to remember. These are: In that order. Pluto was up until very recently considered to be a planet and the farthest one away from the sun. However, its status has changed and it is now considered in astronomy to be a dwarf planet.

How do I learn the Order of the planets?

You can also listen to a catchy song that has the order of the planets in it or listen to a recording of yourself saying the planets in order over and over again. If you're a visual learner, try writing down the order of the planets several times on a piece of paper until you remember.

How do you remember a planet?

Ask a friend or family member to help you study. Recite the names of the planets to them, and they can give you prompts in order to remember. What's a good mnemonic device for the planets? A popular way to remember them is 'My Very Easy Method Just Sums Up Naming Planets'. Note that Pluto is included in this, but it's not a true planet.

How do you order a planet in astrology?

They start with the nearest planet to the Sun. The most common way to order the planets is by their distance from the Sun (starting with the closest one, Mercury). The easiest way to remember the order of the planets is to come up with a mnemonic phrase. The first letter of each word will correspond to the beginning letter of the planet.

How are the planets listed in order?

Using this method, the planets are listed in the following order: AU stands for astronomical units - it's the equivalent to the average distance from Earth to the sun (which is why Earth is 1 AU from the sun). It's a common way astronomers measure distances in the solar system that accounts for the large scale of these distances.
