Does Arizona have a solar tax credit?

In addition to the federal solar tax credit, Arizona residents are eligible for a 25% state solar tax credit, property tax exemption and sales tax exemption on solar equipment. The Grand Canyon State offers a solar tax credit of 25% of your installation costs, up to a maximum of \$1,000.

The Residential Clean Energy Credit, formerly known as the federal investment tax credit (ITC), can reduce your solar panel system's cost by 30%. Your entire system qualifies for this incentive, including equipment, labor, permitting, and sales tax. The average cost for a 5 kW solar panel system is around \$10,538 in Arizona.
